All proceeds from this event will directly fund the Critical Incident Response Service which provides education and peer support to law enforcement and emergency service workers and their families.

Established in 2002, the CIRS has served the needs of emergency response personnel by addressing the potential dangers of their increased exposure to trauma and stress. As you can imagine, law enforcement and emergency service workers are exposed to levels of critical incident stress uncommon for most. They are at a significantly greater risk of emotional, cognitive, and psychological injury than other occupations. Early intervention and response from trained peers has shown to significantly mitigate this damage.

Funding for the CIRS is provided through donations to the FOP of Ohio Foundation, an organization that accepts tax-deductible contributions from individuals, corporations and community organizations. Operational support for the CIRS is provided by the Fraternal Order of Police of Ohio; however, services are available to all emergency service workers, not just FOP members.
